



Ingraham, Chandler “Baxter”

It is with deep sadness that we announce the passing of Chandler Baxter Ingraham, 90, of Margaree Valley, on Thursday, July 4, 2019. Baxter was born on November 28, 1928 in Margaree Valley, the son of the late Osprey and Mabel (Cranton) Ingraham. He will be lovingly missed by his wife of 64 years, Evelyn Mae (Hart) and daughter Kendra, Margaree Valley; brother, Walter (Kay) Ingraham, Coxheath; sister, Kaye Fraser, Annapolis Valley; sister-in-law Kaye Isenor, Port Hastings, and brother-in-law Edsel (Carol) Hart, Margaree Centre. Baxter was a farmer, a carpenter, mill operator and worked as a pulp scaler for Ethridge & Carmichael for a number of years. He owned and operated Ingraham Brothers Store Museum and was passionate about genealogy. Baxter loved the land and forests, he saw the potential in every tree to become a dish, a cane or a beautiful piece of furniture. He was a member of Wilson United Church and contributed to the heritage of the church as a young man, keeping the fires on for services, cutting, transporting firewood (first with horse and sleigh, then with tractor) and storing ice to make ice cream for the many salmon suppers/picnics. He attended Sunday School, Young Peoples' Group, Men's Club and served as an Elder and Church Treasurer. He held offices in the Credit Union and the Volunteer Fire Dept. He supported with interest the formation of the Sunset Funeral Co-operative. Baxter displayed a great sense of humor with family and friends, and was always willing to lend a helping hand to anyone. He had a special ability to turn a serious situation into an adventure. Two of Baxter's greatest regrets were that he could not dance or sing. He was a dedicated gardener and flowers from your summer garden would be appreciated. In 1983 he

walked on a royal red carpet to board the H. M. Yacht Britannia at Halifax as we attended a reception, guests of the Prince and Princess of Wales, Prince Charles and Lady Diana.
