July 13th, 1943 -April 8th, 2021

Angus George Lanceleve Sr of West Lake Ainslie passed away peacefully on April 8th, 2021 from a 4.5 years battle with cancer. Born on July 13th, 1943 to Victor and Clory (Fasco) Lanceleve in Minto, New Brunswick. The family moved to Mount Young on Cape Breton Island. Angus had 3 brothers; Morris, Jule, Louie and 3 sisters; Victoria, Bertha and Clory. In 1963 they moved to Strathlorne.

In 1964 Angus married Hannah Royal of West Lake Ainslie, they built a house on Kenloch hill and raised their children; Judy, Angus Jr, Danny, Jimmy, Lee and Robin. Angus and Hannah went their separate ways; but remained best friends until the day he passed. Hannah had a son after they separated, Coady MacLean, Angus loved him and treated him like his own son.

In 1993 angus met his saviour Rhoda Spencer of Toronto, Ontario. After dating for a year they fell in love and married on August 7th, 1994. Rhoda had a cottage at West Lake Ainslie and this was where they made their home. Angus and Rhoda built the West Lake Ainslie Chapel. The Chapel was built by their hands, heart and money. For the years that followed their marriage they poured their hearts into the Chapel, holding services Saturday morning, transporting people to the services, doctor's appointments, donating food to those in need, always offering these things from their heart. They also held day camps for children in the community and also donated used clothing to people in need. Angus and Rhoda were also big supporters of Sunset Funeral Co-operative and Angus was an active member of the Board of Directors for many years. In 2013 Rhoda

started showing signs of Dementia, as her illness progressed Angus became her full time caregiver. Angus lovingly took care of Rhoda until he was diagnosed with cancer in 2017 at which time he needed help. Angus truly loved Rhoda and we, his family are thankful they found each other and had the wonderful years and the things they accomplished together.

Angus was a very accomplished man. He was a great welder, mechanic and could operate any machine whether it was big or small. He worked at the Pulp Mill in Point Tupper in his younger days then worked at the Strathlorne Tree Nursery where he planned and built many genius creations. One of his biggest accomplishments was his family. He will be missed by his kids and grand kids.
