

Archie Dan MacLellan, Campbellton Road.

It is with sadness we announce the death of Archie Dan MacLellan, Tuesday, June 7, 2022 in Inverness Consolidated Memorial Hospital. He was born May 15, 1931 at Keppoch (Inverness County), a son to the late Dan H. and Katie Jess (Gillis) MacLellan. He is survived by his brother John MacLellan.

Besides his parents he was predeceased by his brother, Simon (Pauline) and his sister, Margaret (Alex) MacDonald and his sister-in-law, Edith.

Archie Dan was well known in Inverness for fixing televisions; but many probably don't know how that all began. He began to study to be an electrician at an early age, this was difficult, at that time there was no electricity on Campbellton Road. After the first couple of years things became a little easier and more successful. I was involved in many projects including building an "oscilloscope". In 1933 Archie Dan and John Walker were invited to Sydney to see the construction of the first TV transmitter in Cape Breton and after that day he knew he would be involved with television.

When CJCB TV started in 1954 they placed transmitters throughout Inverness and Richmond County. In 1959 they set up a transmitter on Cape Mabou and Archie Dan maintained that service until he retired. Not long after his retirement the transmitter became a thing of the past as it was difficult to keep the service up.

There will be visitation from 10 to 10:50 am followed by the Funeral Mass at 11 am in St Margaret's Church, Broad Cove on Saturday, June 11, 2022.
